The Heinz Chapel Choir, founded in 1938, is an auditioned ensemble comprised this semester of one masters and fifty undergraduate students enrolled at the University of Pittsburgh. The talented members devote four hours per week for rehearsals and receive one college credit each semester for their participation. The singers represent forty-nine areas of study, including Chemistry (8), Psychology (5), Computer Science (4), Music (4), Neuroscience (4), Spanish (4), Bioengineering (3), Economics (3), Film Studies (3), French (3), Marketing (3), Accounting (2), Chemical Engineering (2), Communication Sciences and Disorders (2), Global Studies (2), Italian (2), Legal Studies (2), Mathematics (2), Media and Professional Communications (2), Nursing (2), Pre-Med (2), Sociology (2), Theatre (2), Actuarial Math, Anthropology, Architecture, Biology, Classics, Communications, Computer Engineering, Dance, English Literature, English Writing, Fiction Writing, Finance, History, International Business, Korean, Linguistics, Microbiology, Musicology, Natural Science, Nutrition and Dietetics, Pharmacy, Physics, Portuguese, Pre-Pharmacy, Supply Chain Management, and Urban Studies. Nine students are pursuing double majors, thirty-one have declared a minor, and three are undecided.

**Susan Rice** is proud to begin her tenure at the University of Pittsburgh as the director of the Heinz Chapel Choir and Senior Lecturer in Music, teaching the ear-training course sequence. Prior to her appointment at Pitt, Dr. Rice was Assistant Professor of Music at Beloit College in Wisconsin. She has conducted traditional mixed and single-gender choruses of varying sizes, including chamber choirs, symphonic choirs, opera choruses, and vocal jazz ensembles, as well as teaching conducting, music theory, music history, class piano, and interdisciplinary courses. An active clinician, Dr. Rice has worked with choirs in Pennsylvania, Michigan, Illinois and Wisconsin. Her research includes sketch study and compositional process, performance practice of the Baroque and Classical eras, the historical, sociological, and gender issues surrounding women's choruses and singing societies, and multi-disciplinarity as a means of engagement within the choral experience.

Dr. Rice earned degrees at the University of Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music (B.M., music education), Western Michigan University (M.M., choral conducting), and the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign (D.M.A., choral conducting and literature). Before embarking on her graduate studies, she served for eleven years as Director of Choral Music at Pocono Mountain Senior High School in Swiftwater, Pennsylvania, and she is delighted to return to the Keystone State.

**Steven Anisko** is a graduate of the University of Pittsburgh where he studied organ with the late Robert Sutherland Lord. He is a well-known promoter and interpreter of the music of Charles Tournemire. Steve has served as organist at Heinz Chapel since 1999 and is also an alumnus of the Heinz Chapel Choir.
